GRAMMAR SCHOOL The school uniform is compulsory and every item should be named

Blazer	Black Blazer with School crest (boy fit).	Black Blazer with School crest (girl fit).	Must be purchased from School shop. Lapel badges may not be worn (except for a Peer Support, Student Parliament or Library badge).
Trousers	Mid-grey in colour.	Mid-grey in colour	May be purchased from School shop.
Skirt		Years 7 to 8: grey kilt skirt. Years 9 to 11: grey pencil skirt.	May be purchased from School shop. Skirts must be bought at mid knee-length and never be shorter than 5 cm above the knee.
Shirt	White short or long-sleeved shirt without branding or motifs.		Must be tucked into skirts/trousers and top buttons fastened.
School Tie	Wolverhampton Grammar School Red and Black tie.		Must be purchased from School shop and worn to meet top of trousers/skirt. Colours and Honours ties are issued by the School.
Jumper	V-necked, grey in colour (no patterns) with School crest.		Must be purchased from School shop. No baggy jumpers or cardigans. Must not be worn without a blazer.
Socks	Plain socks - black or grey.	Plain socks - black or grey and ankle or knee length.	
Tights		Black, grey or flesh coloured.	Patterned tights are not permitted.
Shoes	Black.	Black	Must be leather or 'leather look'. No trainer/canvas styles, must be conventional style. No ankle boots, heels, stilettos or black trainers.
Belt	Black or Brown.		With a plain buckle.
Outer Coat	Dark colour, plain in style.		No hoodies permitted. Coats and scarves may not be worn in the School grounds unless it is raining or snowing, and must not be worn inside School buildings.
Hair	Hair should be natural in colour.		Must be neat, tidy and unobtrusive.
Jewellery	None except a watch, a single pair of metal plain stud earrings and a single bracelet.		Must be removed for sport. No nose studs.
Make-up/ facial hair	No facial hair. When worn, make-up must be unobtrusive and subtle. Nail varnish should be clear and not coloured.		If you are a boy below the Sixth Form and feel you cannot shave for religious, cultural or health reasons, you should bring a letter to your form tutor from your parents.
